CANTON, Ohio (Nov. 13, 2024) – Aultman has entered into a new collaboration with University Hospitals Seidman Cancer Center to enhance cancer care and clinical research throughout Aultman Health System facilities.

Through this clinical affiliation, Aultman cancer patients will continue to be able to receive high-quality care close to home in Stark County and the surrounding community while also having easy access to services and clinical trials throughout UH Seidman Cancer Center. The affiliation will make it easier for patients to receive advanced care, bring additional services to Canton and raise the level of cancer care available locally, all while allowing Aultman to remain the independent, community-focused healthcare organization it has been for more than a century.

"We are committed to growing the expert, quality care of UH Seidman Cancer Center throughout Northeast Ohio and beyond, and this collaboration is the latest step in realizing that vision," said Ted Teknos, M.D., president and scientific director of UH Seidman Cancer Center and the Jane and Lee Seidman Chair in Cancer Innovation. "We look forward to working with Aultman, while supporting their independence and strengthening the cancer treatment offerings in Stark County and the surrounding communities."

In September 2022, Aultman opened its brand-new Timken Family Cancer Center, a \$28-million addition to the Canton hospital campus that centralized and added services and convenience for cancer patients.

Q&A: Aultman Cancer Center/UH Seidman Cancer Center Affiliation

Q: What is happening?

A: The Aultman Cancer Center has entered into a new collaboration with University Hospitals Seidman Cancer Center to enhance cancer care and clinical research throughout Aultman Health System facilities.

Q: What does this affiliation mean?

A: Through this clinical affiliation, Aultman cancer patients will continue to be able to receive high-quality care close to home in Stark County and the surrounding communities while also having easy access to expanded services and clinical trials throughout UH Seidman Cancer Center. The affiliation will make it easier for patients to receive advanced care, bring additional services to Aultman Cancer Center locations and raise the level of cancer care available locally.

Q: Will Aultman still remain independent?

A: Yes. This affiliation supports our mission, which has not changed: We are committed to remaining independent and staying accountable to the communities we serve.

Q: Will the Aultman Cancer Center remain independent?

A: Yes, Aultman will retain full control of the cancer program. The relationship will allow us to work together to add services locally and collaborate on complex cases.

Q: Is this a step toward UH buying Aultman?

A: No. We are affiliating our cancer program with UH Seidman Cancer Center with the shared goals of keeping Aultman independent and keeping cancer care local.

Q: How will patient care be impacted?

A: Patients will have several benefits as a result of this affiliation. It will allow Aultman and UH physicians and providers to work together on complex cases while also giving patients easy access to second opinions. It will also enable patients to take part in the clinical research offered by both Aultman and UH Seidman Cancer Center.

Q: Will Aultman patients have to spend more time traveling to UH locations for treatment?

A: We're focused on keeping our patients' care in their community and helping them drive less for appointments, treatments and procedures. While some patients may receive tests and procedures that aren't available at Aultman at UH facilities, our shared goal is to maximize patient convenience by delivering the majority of care at Aultman locations in their communities.

Q: How will this affiliation impact Aultman staff members?

A: There is no impact on employment for Aultman staff members as a result of this affiliation.



Q: Why is this affiliation taking place?

A: As the region's leading independent health system, it's important for us to strategically work with other organizations to elevate the patient experience while enhancing both care and clinical research, and that's exactly what this collaboration aims to accomplish. Aultman cancer patients will continue to receive high-quality care close to home in Stark County and the surrounding communities while also having easy access to expanded services and clinical trials throughout UH Seidman Cancer Center.

Q: Why did Aultman choose UH Seidman Cancer Center?

A: UH Seidman Cancer Center is part of the National Cancer Institute (NCI)-designated Case Comprehensive Cancer Center at Case Western Reserve University, one of 57 comprehensive cancer centers in the country. Aultman's affiliation with Seidman provides those patients with the most complex needs a direct connection for second opinions, expanded clinical research and access to advanced treatment options such as stem cell transplants and proton therapy.

Q: How else will this affiliation benefit patients?

A: There will be several notable benefits of this affiliation:

- Aultman patients will have expanded access to additional services locally.
- The affiliation will benefit Aultman with joint physician recruitment and clinical trial collaboration.
- Patients will have greater access and sharing of care paths and specialized case reviews.
- Aultman staff members will have greater access to education and training resources, including additional opportunities for resident and fellow rotations.
